#### **Materials List**

Artist grade Watercolors in tubes - suggested brands: Winsor Newton, Daniel Smith, Schminke, Holbein — (avoid student grade watercolors)

Permanent alizarin crimson Hansa Yellow Cadmium red Cadmium yellow Ultramarine blue

Cerulean blue Burnt Umber Undersea Green (Daniel Smith) Quinacridone Gold Quinacridone Burnt Orange Indigo Sap Green

**Portable watercolor palette** - Mijello Martin Airtight watercolor 18-well works great and is inexpensive; found online

#### **Brushes:**

If you are new to watercolor, I suggest a selection of pointed rounds: # 4,6,8. (Either synthetic or natural bristles)
Synthetic flats: 1/2 inch, 1 inch
For those experienced with watercolor, we can use whatever you have in your arsenal.

# **Paper**

140# Arches Cold Press - either single full sized sheets (divided into quarters) OR blocks (9x12 inches)
Optional: #140 Arches Hot Press - full sheet (22 x 30 inches), divided as needed

Waterproof panel (wood, plastic, plexiglass) for wet work and securing watercolor paper.

Old cloth tea towel

Paper towels/ sponge for blotting and cleaning brushes Masking fluid - FineLine Masking Fluid Pen; or Pebeo drawing gum Two water containers - Larger sized yogurt containers work great Small notebook and pencil Hair dryer
