Watercolors:

There are many good sets of watercolors to use. An inexpensive set that works well is brand named Yarka. You can also find sets that are similar in size and quality in other brands such as Windsor & Newton and Koi.

I use tubes of paint in an empty palette. I squeeze some paint into the wells in the palette and leave the palette opened for a day, so the paint dries a bit. Then, they can be used to paint. If you choose to buy tubes of paint, Here are some suggested colors and brands:
